## Dr. Gustav Fischer Total Joint Replacement After Knee Surgery Instructions



## **Day of Surgery**

- 1. Relax and elevate the leg while at rest.
- 2. Resume your regular diet as tolerated and stay well hydrated.
- 3. Use ice to the surgical site as needed to control pain & swelling.
- 4. Use a walker to help with gait and balance.
- 5. Begin taking your medications on a regular schedule to meet your needs to rest and mobilize. Start anticoagulants (Aspirin, Eliquis, etc.) with breakfast the day after surgery.

## Post-op Day 1

- 1. Continue use of ice to the surgical site as needed. You may remove the ACE wrap.
- 2. Consider rewrapping the ACE if swelling evolves to include the foot, ankle, and calf.
- 3. You may shower leaving the Mepilex silver dressing in place. You can take this dressing off after 7 days. Shower with soap and water, no scrubbing the incision and pat dry lightly.
- 4. If the dressing becomes saturated or starts to come off, it is OK to take off and leave open to air. No topicals or ointments should be applied.
- 5. If there is discharge from the incision, notify the office 503-231-1426, option 4.

## Post-op Day 2

- 1. Continue use of ice to the surgical site as needed.
- 2. Walking should be limited to 500-1000 steps per day.
- 3. Work on Range of Motion exercises 3 times a day.
- 4. Physical therapy should start within 1 week after surgery.
- You can bear full weight on the affected leg as tolerated. It is important to use a walker or cane to prevent falls and reestablish a normal gait pattern. Most patients use a walker for 1-2 weeks and then transition to a cane or walking stick. Your improving gait pattern will be your guide to discontinuing use of a walking aid.
- Swelling, warmth, and redness around the surgical site are common. Bruising may also be present at the surgical site or further down the leg. Ensure the incision stays clean and dry.
- No driving until cleared by your surgical team.
- Unless emergent, it is best to avoid dental work or other invasive procedures for 12 weeks after a total joint replacement.
